

## Welcome to Copenhagen! SIGHTS TO EXPLORE

## **GREEN LINE**

- Axeltorv/Tivoli A stop where you will find the famous Tivoli, historic buildings, shopping arcades, a variety of small and big restaurants, dinner and show entertainment, music and nightlife. Close to the central station with trains departing to Sweden every 20 minutes.
- Rosenborg The palace is opened to the public as a museum. It houses the private collections of the Danish kings, including furniture, paintings, sculptures, etc. In the treasure chamber in the cellar vaults the royal insignia, including the Crown Jewels, are on display.
- The Little Mermaid Maybe the most known attraction in all of Denmark.

  The Little Mermaid is now back from her trip to the World Expo in

  Shanghai and once again reministing over her lost childhood in the sea.
- Langelinie This long pier is perfect for a stroll and a very popular destination in Copenhagen. Most cruise ships arrive and depart here and we arrange pick-up close to your ship.
- The Gefion Four tain A magnificent monument of the goddess Gefion charging four oxen. Situated close to the Citadel and with a great view of Amalienborg Palace.
- Amalienborg The winter home of the Danish Royal Family. Don't miss the changing of guards taking place every day around noon.
  - Bus arrives approx. 30 min after departure from Axeltorv/Tivoli.
- Nyhavn/Kongens Nytorv A colorful 17th century waterfront, canal and popular entertainment district. Sightseeing boats sailing the harbor and canals depart from here. Departure for Nettobådarna, included in our Bus-boat combi travelpass.
  - Bus arrives approx. 45 min after departure from Axeltorv/Tivoli.

- Casino Copenhagen Casino, once a theatre is now open for gaming.

  French Roulette, Black Jack and poker of all kinds are found here.
- The Operan A fascinating building from the outside with interesting plays on the inside.
- Christiania One of Denmark's biggest tourist attractions. A "hippie" village in the city loved by many and hated by some, a must see.
- City Hall (Rådhuset) An impressive building at the City Hall Square, still in use as the city court of Copenhagen. Inside you will find the Jens Olsen World Clock. A good starting point to go shopping at Strøget and Nytorv.
- Nettobådarna Boat tour is included in our Bus-boat combi travelpass.
