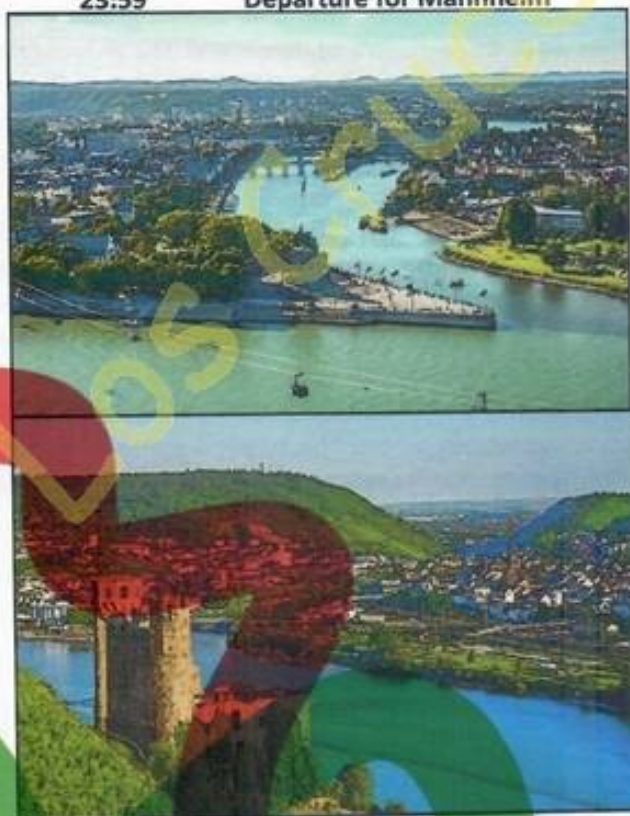

Koblenz

Koblenz, the former residence of the Electors of Trier, is beautifully situated at the junction of the Mosel and Rhine rivers. The city straddles both banks of each river, and has for centuries been an important defensive and economic center. Its strategic value can be seen in the remains of the many old fortifications built here, most notably the old castle of Ehrenbreitstein, which dominates the right bank of the wide Rhine. Koblenz also boasts many other well-preserved historic attractions, from sumptuous old palaces to some of the oldest churches in Germany. It's also perfectly positioned to explore the UNESCO World Heritage portion of the Rhine Valley, as well as the beautiful Mosel Valley region.

Deutsches Eck: The German Corner. The German Corner, or Deutsches Eck, refers to the long slip of land between the Rhine and Mosel rivers. Projecting into the fast flowing waters like the bow of a ship (it's a great spot for one of those Titanic-like movie shots), the meeting place of these two mighty rivers has been an important part of the city's natural defenses since 1216 when the Order of Teutonic Knights settled here (the remains of their old fortification, Deutschherrenhaus, lie nearby). In addition to its magnificent views over the rivers and the Rhine Valley, the German Corner is home to the city's impressive Monument to Emperor Wilhelm I, a spectacular 37-meter-tall equestrian statue of the old king.

The Fortress of Ehrenbreitstein. Perched 118 meters above Koblenz on the east bank of the Rhine, the Fortress of Ehrenbreitstein (Festung Ehrenbreitstein) was built between 1817 and 1828 on the ruins of an older fort destroyed by the French. Now part of the Upper Middle Rhine Valley UNESCO World Heritage Site, it's best to approach the site via a fun cable car trip - the longest in Germany - across the Rhine with its superb views over the town and the two rivers. In addition to exploring the old battlements and the fort's



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many exhibits, visitors can enjoy a number of museums here, including the State Museum of Koblenz with its rich archaeological and historic collections, and a memorial dedicated to fallen soldiers of WWI. Other experiences offered include a unique Baroque dining package, along with a program of music and theatrical productions.

Old Town Koblenz. As with so many of Germany's lovely old towns and cities, the old town center of Koblenz has been painstakingly restored after the devastation of WWII. Highlights of a walking tour of the area include the Town Hall (Rathaus), built between 1695 and 1700, in front of which can be seen the humorous Schängelbrunnen, a monument designed in 1940 by Carl Burger and dedicated to poet Josef Cornelius who penned the lyrics for the city's "hymn" (watch out for the spitting boy). Also worth visiting is the Florinsmarkt, home to the Romanesque and Gothic 12th-century Florinskirche, and the Altes Kaufhaus, the Old Merchants' Hall.

Rüdesheim

Drosselgasse. The heart of Rüdesheim's old town is a meeting place for locals and visitors from all over the world. This is where the music is and where it never stops! Whether you're after something lively or classical, romantic or groovy, from brass bands to string quartets, from dusk until dawn. There's a wide range of wine bars and garden taverns to satisfy everyone. Come to Drosselgasse and revel in its unique atmosphere.

Catholic parish church of Saint James. The parish church of Saint James situated on the market square dates back to the 14th century and is believed to have been built by the German knight, Johann Brömser. The bell tower is crowned with a weather vane with half-moon and star in remembrance of the Crusades, which Brömser fought in. After being almost entirely destroyed in 1944, the building was subsequently rebuilt using quarry stone from the Rhineland. Visitors to the church will find the medieval carved tombstones of the Rüdesheim nobility as well as the gothic tympanum of particular interest.

Benedictine Abbey of Saint Hildegard. Come and visit the Benedictine Abbey of Saint Hildegard situated among the vineyards above Rüdesheim. The community of nuns here live according to the Rule of Saint Benedict

and in keeping with the traditions of Saint Hildegard. Prayer and work, contemplation and action, seclusion and hospitality all characterise their way of life. Those who make the journey uphill to discover this peaceful commune are greeted by a magnificent panoramic view of the Middle Rhine Valley. The abbey church is well worth a visit, whether to study the frescos painted in the style of the Beuron art school or simply for silent contemplation. An extensive shop offers an exquisite range of items for sale, including a large assortment of books, cards and artwork from its own studios, as well as a selection of fine wines, sparkling wines and liqueurs produced from the abbey's very own vineyards.

Siegfried's Mechanical Music Cabinet. "You won't believe your ears" once you embark on a musical adventure into the world of historical automated instruments. Come and see a vast collection, dating back three centuries, of fascinating musical instruments that function like computers, ranging from tiny, delicate music boxes to an enormous orchestrion. Tools and machines for the production of organ pipes, cardboard sheet music, rolls of sheet music and perforated disks are also on display in the collection.

Cable car to Niederwald Monument. A highlight of any stay in Rüdesheim is the ride in a cable car up to the Germania monument. The awe-inspiring panoramic views over Rüdesheim's oldtown and the shimmering waters of the Rhine dotted with green isles make the smooth glide over the vineyards a very special experience. The station at the base can be found in the pedestrianised area on Oberstrasse.

Eagle Tower. The 20.5-meter-high late Gothic corner tower of the old town fortification was built in the 15th century and formerly stood directly on the Rhine. The dungeon located in the basement was only accessible through an opening in the vault crown. In the last century the „Zum Adler“ (Eagle) inn, was located in the tower and is where the tower's name is derived from. Johann Wolfgang von Goethe is known to have stayed here on his visits to Rüdesheim.

Name	Letter code	Indicates
Cereals Containing gluten	A	This includes wheat, rye, barley, and oats. It is often found in foods containing flour such as some baking powders, batter, breadcrumbs, bread, cakes, couscous, meat products, pasta, pastry, sauces, soups and foods dusted with flour. The cereal will need to be declared
Crustaceans	B	This includes crabs, lobster, prawns and scampi. It is often found in shrimp paste.
Eggs	C	This is often found in cakes, some meat products, mayonnaise, mousses, pasta, quiche, sauces and foods brushed or glazed with eggs.
Fish	D	This is often found in some fish sauces, pizzas, relishes, salad dressings, stock cubes and in Worcestershire sauce
Peanuts	E	This can be found in biscuits, cakes, curries, dessert, ice cream and sauces such as for satay. It is also found in groundnut oil and peanut flour.
Soya	F	This can be found in bean curd, edamame beans, miso paste, textured soya protein, soya flour or tofu. It is often found used in some dessert, ice cream, meat products, sauces and vegetarian products.
Milk	G	This is found in butter, cheese, cream, milk powders, and yoghurts. Foods glazed with milk, powdered soups, desserts and sauces
Nuts	H	This includes almonds, hazelnuts, walnuts, cashew, pecan nuts, brazil nuts, pistachio nuts, macadamia or queenland nuts. These can be found in breads, biscuits, crackers, desserts, ice cream, marzipan, nut oils and sauces
Celery	L	This includes celery stalks, leaves, and seeds and celeriac. This is often found in celery salt, salads, soups and stock cubes
Mustard	M	This includes liquid mustard, mustard powder and mustard seeds. It is often found in breads, curries, marinades, meat products, salad dressings, sauces and soups.
Sesame seeds	N	This can be found in bread, breadsticks, humous, sesame, sesame oil and tahini (sesame paste)
Sulphur dioxide *	O	This is often used as a preservative in dried fruit, meat products, soft drinks and vegetables as well as in wine and beer.
Lupin	P	This includes lupin seeds and flour, and can be found in some types of bread, pastries and pasta
Molluscs	R	This includes mussels, land snails, squid, and whelks. It is often found in oyster sauce or as a ingredient in a fish stews.
